**Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary -  
Holy Day of Obligation  
Thursday, August 15th**

On August 15th we celebrate “The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven” at the end of her earthly life. The Feast of the Assumption is a very old feast of the Church, celebrated universally since the sixth century. It commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven, before her body could begin to decay - - a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin’s passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts.

## Back to School Supplies Backpack Project



All too soon, the stores will be rotating their merchandise to accommodate school supplies.

Notebooks, backpacks, crayons, markers... the list goes on! We can all remember what it was like to open that new box of crayons on the first day of school and the colorful new folders for homework and bringing home projects that you completed.

The Social Action Group has an annual school supply drive in hopes of packing enough school supplies to pack 75 backpacks. We will deliver them to the schools in the West Fargo School District.

Your generous efforts have helped so many children over the years.

A new box of crayons can be quietly slipped to the student who doesn't have one.

A bottle of glue can be given to a student who never gets the empty one replaced.

The student who only has 1 notebook can be given another one.

Scissors that have gone lost or funds weren't available to buy can be offered.

Sometimes families go through medical and financial hardships and the school supply list of the broken, lost or used up school supplies gets lost in a sea of bills and forgotten about when families are dealing with a crisis. Sometimes kids don't even ask and do without because they know there is barely money for food and they don't want to ask for that new bottle of glue. What you donated can then be given to help the children with their needs and help eliminate some of the stress and worry at home..

## Catechist

For Holy Cross Catholic Church!

### **What is a catechist?**

A "catechist" is a faith formation teacher. At Holy Cross, we have consistently had over 75 catechists involved in our program. Come and join us!

### **What will I be doing?**

In a class of between 8-12 young people from our parish, you will share your faith. To do so, you receive a catechist textbook to help with lesson planning, orientation at the beginning of the school year, and formation (training) with other catechists in our area. You will be given a plan for the year (syllabus) which will outline the chapter to teach for the week, and which themes are included in the lesson.

### **How often will I teach?**

Our classes currently meet approximately 3 times a month, starting in September. The class session lasts 1 hour. We have class sessions available on Wednesdays and Sundays. You'll never teach on a major holiday.

### **What other responsibilities do I have? What is expected of me?**

We expect that our catechists:

- ❖ Are excited about the Catholic faith, and believe that the youth of our parish are worth their time and effort
- ❖ Are actively practicing their faith, which includes attending Eucharistic liturgy each week
- ❖ Arrange for a substitute if they are not able to make a class session, and inform the Director of Faith Formation (sub list is provided)
- ❖ Allow themselves time to prepare each weekly lesson, and ask for help when they need it
- ❖ Will arrive to class at least 10 minutes early.
- ❖ Will follow the policies of Holy Cross Church/Trinity School.
- ❖ Will uphold the discipline policies set by the Faith Formation program

### **What benefits will I receive?**

- Besides receiving the satisfaction that you are doing what the Church asks by planting the seeds of faith in the hearts of the youth, giving of your time, and of your talent, you also receive:
- ❖ Access to several catechist periodicals, many prayer and activity books, tapes, CDs, videos, and art supplies
  - ❖ Tuition waived for your children, if you teach for the full year
  - ❖ Recognition at the Holy Cross Spring Volunteer Appreciation Dinner
  - ❖ Ongoing training and support

### **And these intangible benefits are also given to our Holy Cross catechists:**

- ❖ Monthly Mass offered in honor and support of the catechists
- ❖ The reward of working with youth and handing on the faith to the next generation of Catholics
- ❖ A chance to meet new people in the community and get involved
- ❖ The opportunity to learn more about your faith, and deepen your own prayer life

### **I want to teach, but I'm not sure if I'm ready for my own class...**

That's just fine! In fact, we would prefer if EVERY class of Faith Formation was taught by two catechists. If you are interested in being a team-teacher, first see if there is another parent, adult, or friend that might be interested in teaching with you. Or, you can let the Faith Formation office know that you would like to team-teach, and we will pair you with someone who is also interested in team-teaching. Usually team-teachers are together consistently in the classroom, however some choose to switch teaching responsibilities each week.

**I've never done this before. It's been a long time since I was in class, as a young person. I just don't think I know enough.**

Our first requirement is that you actively practice your faith and have the desire to share it. We do not require a degree in theology, but a firm intention to learn as you teach. The catechist's manual will help you get started with lesson plans you can follow, ideas for activities, and prayers and reflections for your benefit. The Faith Formation Director and the Catechist Formation Workshop will aid you in feeling comfortable, confident, and able to share what you know -- as you learn throughout the year even more about your faith!

**I'd like to be involved in the program, but I'm not able to teach. How else can I help?**

We are also looking for session coordinators. The coordinators take attendance, monitor halls, and help with special projects. If you coordinate for a full year, your child/children's tuition is waived!

If you cannot commit to year long teaching or coordinating, you can help out as a Room Parent. Room parents sit in on their child's/children's class for a total of 3 times (this is 3 times total regardless of how many children you have). They assist their child's catechist with anything that they may need help with that day.

We always need substitute catechists, helpers for sacramental preparation, and people who would like to help with special events. It's a great way to get started and learn more about the program.
